What's in Allie Moore's Shed??



1930 Austin 7 Ulster – Austin 7's production racing car, they made 200 of them. There are more than 200 of "them" around now!! This is a real one, with a deep sump, pressure fed engine. My Dad and his pal re-built two identical Ulsters back in the 50's and raced them all round the UK club circuits.

It is much modified for racing – hydraulic brakes, alloy head, water pump where the dynamo once was, and the chassis has been drilled to oblivion, so it weighs only 6 cwt! It was fitted with a supercharger and ran on a benzol/ethanol mixture. Dad taught me to drive in it when I was about 14, and a few years later I was racing it, and beat his best lap time at Silverstone circuit by half a second!!

I was clocked at 95 Miles per hour on the back straight – not bad for

a 747cc engine. Nowadays it is de-tuned for road running, I have removed the supercharger, fitted an alternator and a starter motor. It's great fun to drive, and can sustain 60 Miles per hour, whilst giving 30 miles to the gallon.



Takga Time

Top of the South member Jon Haack takes on a project to rejuvenate a well known TR3 with a history of track and road competition



Since the production of TR's began back in the early 1950's they have been a popular choice amongst those with a bent towards motor racing. Across the decades many TR's have featured in road and track events and there are still those today with a passion for historic and classic race cars who keep the Marque alive and in front of the public gaze

One such person is Marlborough based Jon Haack who has recently acquired a well campaigned TR3 that he is now breathing fresh life into with a view to competing in Targa events, VCC classic racing events as well being able to attend local outings. Targa cars are required to be road legal which means you can do a picnic run one day and thrash it on a track the next – perfect for someone with a hankering for some competitive sport (much like our editor!).

Jon's car was originally imported from the USA in 1995 as a standard car and was then built up into a race car and raced a few times before being sold in 1998 to Rod and Anne Corbett. They set the car up for, and successfully competed in, Targa Rallies, track and street races and hill climb events building quite a race history which Jon is still researching.



Rod still campaigns a nicely prepared, red TR3A which many will be familiar with. In Jon's words "Rod had undertaken the largest a m o u n t o f t h e restoration before telling me I needed to buy it from him, finish the rebuild and come Classic racing. what could I do? I've been told on many occasions that it's about

time that I grew up and being a racing car driver was something I was going to do when I got to that day.

"Basically the car came as the photo shows with a beautiful paint job, new alloy head and sump (goodie ones of course!) a few boxes of parts and two people waving good-bye to their baby with tears in their eyes. Now all that is needed is to clean up the box of parts, figure out what some of them are and put her back together again how hard can that be??



Luckily for me I have a good mate who has more expertise than you can shake a stick at! He's the expert and I'm the gofer - an arrangement I'm entirely comfortable with! Being a retired builder I am fortunate to have a good-sized shed that is ideal for working on Projects however my tools are mainly of the woodworking kind ideal if I'd bought an older wood-framed car perhaps! Fortunately my mate has all the necessary tools to get the job completed."

Exactly when the car will be completed is yet to be confirmed. "By Christmas," says Jon, "but which Christmas has yet to be decided!"

At the time of writing the engine work had just been completed and fired up for the first time and was running sweetly. Whatever the final completion day turns out to be we will be looking forward to seeing another TR on the road in the Top of the South and also campaigning on the classic race circuit and Targa rallies around other parts of the country.


With a little smile to the driver, she again reached behind to unzip a little more and again was unable to take the step.

After becoming quite frustrated and embarrassed, she once again attempted to unzip her skirt more in order to allow more leg room to get on the first step of the bus.


About this time, a large Texan who was standing behind her picked her up easily by the waist and placed her gently on the step of the bus,

Hello All Members

BOOKING SYSTEMS

Many Restaurants and Cafes are now insisting that bookings are confirmed some days prior to attending their establishment. Further they may well insist that even if you do not attend that the meal isto paid for.

This has come about due to them having to order and have enough food for the numbers booked and also have enough staff on hand to provide the service.

They will often have to throw out unused food and pay stay even if people don't show.

On this basis the club, for many functions, may require you to:

- 1. Confirm your booking/attendance by a given date prior to the event.
- 2. If equired, either pay a deposit or the full amount prior to the date specified.
- 3. If you decide to cancel after the given date, prior to the event, there will in all probability, be no fefund
- 4. If you decide after the given date, prior to the event, that you wish to attend then in all probability you will be excluded.
- 5. If you just show up to attend any function with out confirming bookings/attenance then your participation will be at the discretion of the establishment we are attending. Please do not be offended if you are excluded.
- 6. If the club is subsidising the cost of the event and you do not attend without notifying the club by the given date, prior to the event then you may well be required to refund the club the subsidised amount. This is because the club will be having to pay for your participation in the event even though you do not attend and this results in a direct loss to the club and its members.

When required please ensure your payment is made to the **CORRECT** account specified.

Also please ensure that on the Payee details your:

- 1. Your surname and initials are entered in the Particulars column
