It was also pleasing to have members putting themselves forward to join The Committee and other than the position of Vice President elect we are fully covered for 2025.


















Recent Events

A group of 17 members & cars gathered on an overcast morning at Blenheim Railway Station with the forecast promise of a fine sunny summer's day.


As our 10am coffee was finished the sun was peeking through and by the time we got to Picton then Waikawa, we had a stunning clear day.


also followed us down the wrong road.

In 2018 a booklet was published by a club member called Denis LeCren in the club. I have found such book and have decided over the next few newsletters we will have a history lesson on how and who was involved in your club. You will be surprised as some of these members are still in your club today – tells you something about this club then doesn't it. Read on



n 4th February 1995 the very first 'New Zealand National Classic Car Rally' was held in Christchurch organised by Roy Hughes and Colin Hey. Soon after this, the 'Classic Motoring Society of NZ' was formed and they became an Incorporated Society.

In February 1996 the Westport Rotary asked Russell Egan and Pat Pascoe if they could arrange a few cars for the Westport Air Show. About 40 vehicles took part in an enjoyable weekend.

At the launch of Mike Stepehen's book covering the 'Tahunanui Beach Racing' in mid 1996 at the Nelson Car Club rooms a discussion between Pat Pascoe, Denis & Helen Le Cren, Russell Egan and Winston Williamson was held about the idea of forming a new laid-back club catering for maybe less competitive enthusiasts just wanting to enjoy great motoring and good company in classic cars.

In February 1997 the Westport Air Show was repeated and they asked the Classic Racing Society of Christchurch to join in. They agreed and decided to hold their AGM at the same time and as Pat was a member of that club he was given approval to form a branch in Nelson.

Pat Pascoe then arranged the first unofficial meeting of interested members in early 1997 and it was decided to hold another meeting to discuss forming a branch of the Christchurch Society. Soon after this, Pat contacted a large number of local people to hold a meeting in the 'Nelson City Club'.

At that meeting at which two members of the Christchurch club attended, it was decided to go ahead with forming a Branch of the Christchurch Society and a committee of Pat Pascoe as President, Denis Le Cren as Deputy President, Winston Williamson as Treasurer, Maxine Birchfield/McKean as Secretary, Max Clarke as Club Captain and a committee of Gordon Routledge and Bob Brougham was voted in. This meeting was in March 1997 and by August of that year the membership numbered 64 with an annual subscription set at \$20/year. Twenty one years later the subscription has remained the same, partly due to our desire to own no property.



Pat served as President for two years and then Denis for another two years followed by Kevin York for two years then Helen Le Cren for three years. During this time, partly due to problems communicating with Christchurch it was decided to become an independent body and in 2005 we set up our own set of rules so we became 'The Classic Motoring Society of Nelson Inc'. Frank Giffith took over as President in 2006.

Due to health issues Maxine resigned later in 1997 and Pat Dodson took over and with his frightening efficiency, served the Society for many years.

During these years a large number of events were held and some traditions created. Helen suggested the title 'Lord Nelson Rally' for our biennial rallies and also for the 'Lord Nelson Charity Parade' and obtained permission to use the Lord Nelson Graphic from the 'Nelson Mail'.

Another tradition started at this time was the Christmas BBQ at Rabbit Island with free Champagne and Xmas cake but sadly this has not been held in recent times. It was also

decided to hold our AGMs at Havelock to make it easier for members from both Nelson and Blenheim to attend.

The 'Lord Nelson Rally' has continued to be well supported but the 'Lord Nelson Charity Parade' had be discontinued partly due to problems and costs with Health and Safety. Ironic when the very reason for the event was to help with health issues! This event raised \$31538.03 for the Nelson Regional Hospice Trust between 2003 - 2012.

EXERCISES FOR SENIORS




Next, I started putting a few potatoes IN the sacks, but I would caution you not to overdo it at this level.

Hello All Members

BOOKING SYSTEMS

Many Restaurants and Cafes are now insisting that bookings are confirmed some days prior to attending their establishment. Further they may well insist that even if you do not attend that the meal isto paid for.

This has come about due to them having to order and have enough food for the numbers booked and also have enough staff on hand to provide the service.

They will often have to throw out unused food and pay stay even if people don't show.

On this basis the club, for many functions, may require you to:

- 1. Confirm your booking/attendance by a given date prior to the event.
- 2. If equired, either pay a deposit or the full amount prior to the date specified.
- 3. If you decide to cancel after the given date, prior to the event, there will in all probability, be no fefund
- 4. If you decide after the given date, prior to the event, that you wish to attend then in all probability you will be excluded.
- 5. If you just show up to attend any function with out confirming bookings/attenance then your participation will be at the discretion of the establishment we are attending. Please do not be offended if you are excluded.
- 6. If the club is subsidising the cost of the event and you do not attend without notifying the club by the given date, prior to the event then you may well be required to refund the club the subsidised amount. This is because the club will be having to pay for your participation in the event even though you do not attend and this results in a direct loss to the club and its members.

When required please ensure your payment is made to the **CORRECT** account specified.
