65 members in 43 cars, a good number from "over the hill", visited Richard Conlon's, Tasman Coachbuilders restoration of veteran and vintage vehicles .we were blown away with his skills exhibited on various Austin Healey, Jaguar XK 150 's, a 1930's Delage race car and Norton race bikes from a bygone era .Michael Crehan was on hand to outline his intentions for his Delage and gave a fascinating talk on his previous life in England owning and racing, aero engine veteran, rear braked only, mammoth monsters, which could be driven on the road to race meetings. Imagine trying that here.

After coffee at the Grape Escape, it was on to Nelson Airport to have a look at Min Caldwell's stable of 4 aircraft. A Russian Albatross jet trainer, which arrived in a container from the Ukraine and took 4 years to assemble using a meccanno manual (not) is his favourite beast and can often be seen flying over Nelson /Tasman, often wrong side up. His other aircraft included a 3/4 scale, WW2 Mustang, powered by a V6 Suzuki, that he recently been completed and an aircraft that he built with students from the local colleges.
