
Hello Classic Car Members

Building a replica model of our 1929 Sounds Launch VECA proved the ideal project. The original was built on a steep section in Evans Bay, Wellington by Jude's grandfather. The bow stem was cut from a rata tree in the Akatararas and her hull is 1 ¼ kauri. She weighs in at 7 tons so she required the combined power of 2 Wellington Coal trucks to haul her up above the house on a specially constructed



PCNZ Supports the Blenheim Hospice Car Show (again)

arch is the month when the Marlborough and Nelson regions get together to hold a fundraising event for the Marlborough Hospice. This year it was held on Sunday, March 15 and I think we were lucky to be able to attend one of the last large public gatherings before COVID-19 closed down just about everything in New Zealand.

With the news already full of dire warnings about the ease of transmission of this new disease and the desirability of social distancing, we still had a beautiful day and a large turnout of cars and people.

PCNZ was represented by ten Club members and a total of nine genuine Porsches and one Cartel 550 Spyder replica. The Cartel sported a well built space frame chassis with a fibreglass replica 550 body, fitted with a flat 4 by Subaru. With turbo power and a 5-speed transaxle, I imagine it would move along quite well.





Hans Blohm was the first on site in his 356. He and Angie had staked out a nice position under some trees and had also co-opted the participation of a Cayman S owned by his Blenheim friend Colin Marsden. As Mark Randall was in Cook Strait laying fibre optic cables, it was good to have two Caymans as part of our line-up.

Nelson was first represented by Paul and Coral Heywood who had come over the day before to support the local tourism industry by taking the mailboat cruise to Ships Cove, then staying with the Andersons overnight. Later in the morning, Brian Choate arrived in his 996 Turbo S, having had to take a circuitous route via Gueen Charlotte Drive and Picton, for reasons he'd rather not explain!

Kip and Sue Colvey brought their "Number Two" 356 and it attracted a bit of attention because Kip had printed an abridged write-up on the history of the car. One pleasant surprise was the arrival of another Porsche owner, Peet van Beek, with his green 3.2 Carrera Targa. We hadn't seen him since about 2016! Guy Pickering's red Boxster and our blue 928 S4 made up the rest of the group.

We had our information cards written up and displayed by 10:00am, and then it was a relaxing time at our picnic table with a socially responsible low alcohol beer or three, followed by a few sausages and steaks on the bbq.

The weather was very sunny and warm for most of the day and this encouraged a great turnout from the locals, with over 5000 people attending and 520 cars and trucks on display.

It was thought to be the biggest car show yet and raised approximately \$9,500 for the Marlborough Hospice.

Hopefully, we will soon be able to get out in our cars again for something more than just a shopping trip or getting to the mailbox. Until then, shine up that Porschel

Membership lists for circulation to members and Privacy Act position for our Club

The Privacy Act 1993 applies to personal information.

Under the Privacy Act the Club can put out a membership list to its members for membership use only

- Providing that the Club notifies its members that the information will only be disclosed to its members only and for their use in connection with the club only.
- The list is published with such notice.
- The membership list will only show names, phone numbers and district of resident.
- That all members be given an option to opt out of a circulated membership list.

Did you know: Expired WOFS, Regos and licences extended

The legislative changes also allow temporary suspension of the requirement to have a current vehicle licence if it expired on or after 1 January 2020. But if a vehicle licence (rego) has lapsed, the owner will still be required to pay the fees for the entire period it remains expired.

Emergency legislation passed in April granted six months extensions to all WOFS and COFS, and driver licences, that expired on or after 1 January 2020.

While the extension was for a maximum of 6 months (to around 10 October), the NZ Transport Agency can shorten this with notification.


Jill's Old Car

Jill's car was old and unreliable, and she called John for a ride every time it broke down.


