CLUB CAPTAINS REPORT

What a great Christmas picnic held at Foresters Cafe grounds on Sunday 23rd January in stunning weather in a lovely park like setting. An excellent turnout and a great range of vehicles although the number of true pre-80's cars would have numbered less than 5 of the 45 attendees. This where the Classic Car Clubs are heading as we all age disgracefully and find getting in and out of our toys a bit harder. Our next aim must be to attract younger members, even though our club membership continues to hold numbers and is in great heart.

What really amused me was that we arrived in Jude's, "Home for the Bewildered " BMW i3, which created so much interest it was like bees round a honeypot. Evidently we are the first Classic Car Club members to have openly "crossed to the other side " and joined the electric revolution . 
